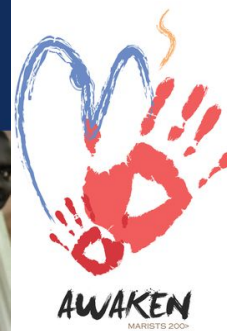

## From The Principal

Dear Parents and Carers and friends of the Trinity Catholic College community,

Over the past few weeks I have had the wonderful opportunity to meet parents and students through our Stage 4, 5, and 6 Evenings. As someone new to the College I was most impressed with the night and the opportunity provided to parents to meet the wonderful Pastoral Care teachers who will look after your children during 2017. I ask parents to contact these teachers as your first point of contact as most issues can be easily addressed at this level. Our pastoral meetings lay the foundation for good teaching and learning.

### Preparing for Learning

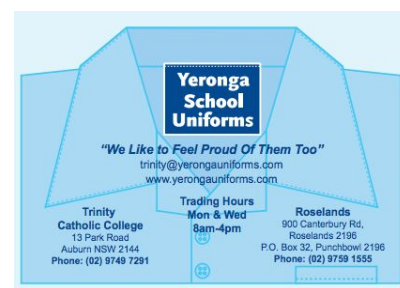

## Ash Wednesday, 2017

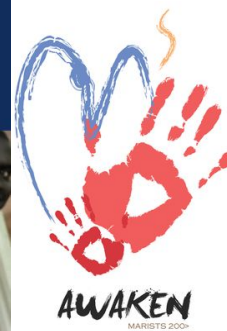

## Message from Pope Francis

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

*Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to the certain goal of Easter, Christ's victory over death. This season urgently calls us to conversion. Christians are asked to return to God "with all their hearts" (Joel 2:12), to refuse to settle for mediocrity and to grow in friendship with the Lord. Jesus is the faithful friend who never abandons us. Even when we sin, he patiently awaits our return; by that patient expectation, he shows us his readiness to forgive (cf. Homily, 8 January 2016).*



*Lent is a favorable season for deepening our spiritual life through the means of sanctification offered us by the Church: fasting, prayer and almsgiving. At the basis of everything is the word of God, which during this season we are invited to hear and ponder more deeply. I would now like to consider the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (cf. Lk 16:19-31). Let us find inspiration in this meaningful story, for it provides a key to understanding what we need to do in order to attain true happiness and eternal life.*

## Introducing Jamie Manalaotao

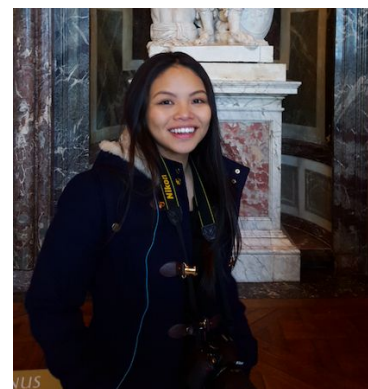
We are excited to introduce to you Jamie Manalaotao.

Training will commence on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> February for Under 6's and 7's at 5.30pm, Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> February for Under 8's and 9's at 5.30pm and Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> February for Under 10's and 11's at 5.30 pm. Other age groups to be advised at time of registration

A "NO PAY-NO PLAY" policy will cover all age groups. This means that to play soccer, registration fees must be paid in full when registering. For families experiencing financial difficulty, please contact one of the Club Officials so that we can discuss your situation. Also please note that our fees increased slightly this season despite rises by GDSFA, FFA and FNSW (referee fees which are controlled by FNSW have increased)

**NOTE:** A family discount of \$20.00 applies to the second and subsequent family members registering within the club. The family discount applies regardless of the age or division in which the additional family member plays. Players playing above their age group due to no team being entered in their age group will only pay the fee of their age group. However a player choosing to play in an older age group, when a team has been entered into their age group, will pay the fee of the older age group.
