Key Improvements / Strategies

1. Further develop a systematic and cohesive approach to nurturing the sense of Church and the religious leadership of school staff. Trinity Catholic College will pilot a small group program for staff Faith Formation in 2017.
2. The development and implementation of a comprehensive framework for Youth Ministry which aligns Archdiocesan, regional and local approaches, including active participation in the Australian Catholic Youth Festival. Trinity Catholic College will pilot a Youth Ministry program in 2017.

Learning and Teaching



Key Improvements / Strategies

- 1.** Revision of system policies and procedures in light of the Authentic Learning statement. Trinity Catholic College will implement Higher School Certificate changes and reforms through new programs, assessment schedules and tasks for English, Mathematics, Science and History. These will align with the new syllabi for Preliminary courses, commencing in 2018.
- 2.** Expansion of the use of online and blended approaches to learning for both students and staff. The College has developed Trinity Learning Communities (TLCs) and will pilot these TLC's on the Regents Park Campus.
- 3.** Revision of system policies and procedures in light of the Authentic Learning statement. Literacy and Numeracy targeted for improvement through resourcing of Teachers in Charge and Quicksmart Programs.
- 4.** Development of staff capacity and resources to better support students with diverse learning needs. The College is establishing a Newman Selective Gifted stream in Years 7 and 9, which will extend to Yr 7 to 10 in 2018.
