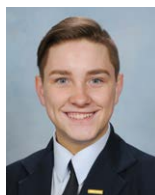

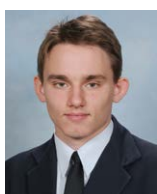

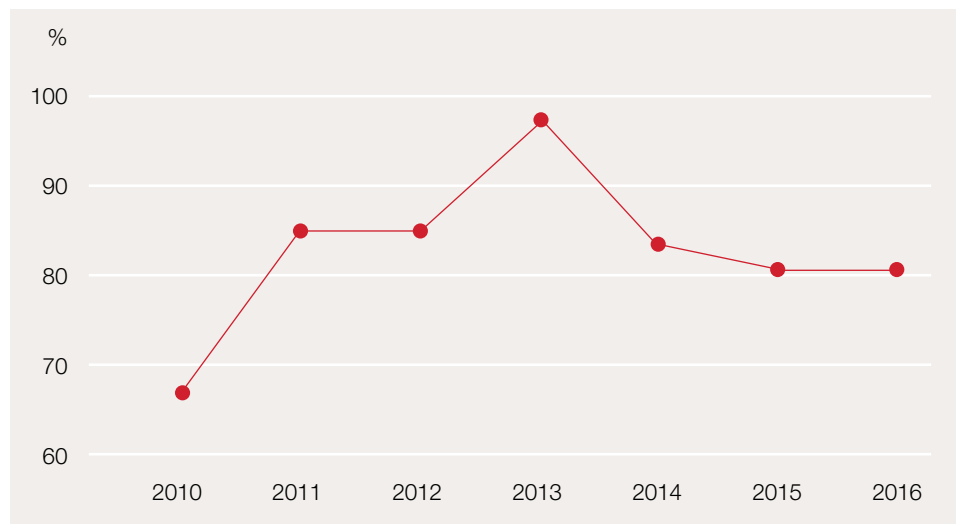

HSC courses above

Trinity Catholic College students have again performed solidly in the Higher School Certificate. In the 2016 HSC, Trinity students recorded **93** Band 6's or distinguished achievers (scores of 90 or greater).

26 students scored an ATAR above **90**.

185 students in Year 12 sat the HSC with approximately 939 exam papers in 32 different courses of which **81%** of these courses were above the state average.
